


Nanavati Hospital's radiology dept bags NABH—MIS accreditation

The MRI department has a 32-channel wide-bore, short tunnel whole body 3 Tesla machine which provides excellent image quality with several advanced studies such as cardiac MRI, MR Spectroscopy, cartilage mapping etc.
