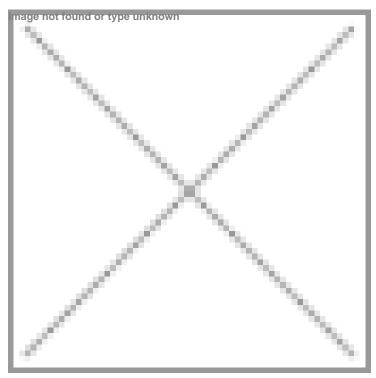


Theme for National Science Day sets in as 'Indigenous Technologies for Viksit Bharat'
