MedTech Day 2026 facilitated direct dialogue between founders and key decision-makers

The programme included startup showcases, venture pitches, and ecosystem roundtables focusing on regulatory readiness, procurement pathways, pilot deployments, and commercialisation strategies. Participating startups represented diverse sectors such as medical devices, digital health, AI-powered diagnostics, digital therapeutics, and advanced drug delivery systems.

Speaking at the event, Anand Sri Ganesh, CEO of NSRCEL, said that India's healthcare innovation ecosystem is entering a pivotal phase, with startups building breakthrough technologies while addressing core challenges around access, affordability, and scalability. Platforms such as MedTech Day, he noted, help startups move faster from lab development to real-world healthcare impact.
